In celebration of Law Day, Wednesday, May 1st, the DC Courts will host a Law Day lecture by Mr. Hari Jones recognizing the 150th Anniversary of the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation by President Abraham Lincoln.

The event will take place at the Lincoln Statue, along the Indiana Avenue side of the Historic Courthouse (451 Indiana Ave, NW) from 1-2pm. The statue was the first publicly-funded statue of the president after his assassination, a gesture from the city in which he was slain.
