FREE LEGAL SERVICES PROVIDERS FOR NON-CRIMINAL APPELS

The following legal services organizations may be able to represent you at the D.C. Court of Appeals without you having to pay for their lawyers' time. However, some might charge for costs that are part of the case, like a filing fee to the court. These organizations are not required to represent you and can only represent some of the people who ask for their help. If you want free representation in your non-criminal appeal, you may call these organizations to find out how to apply for their free legal help. Whenever you meet with a legal services organization, please bring all documents concerning your appeal.

You can also receive free legal advice and brief services (regardless of your income) from volunteer attorneys at the monthly **D.C. The clinic addresses a wide variety of civil legal problems governed by D.C. or federal law but *does not* assist with criminal, criminal record expungement, immigration, small business, tenant association, or traffic issues.
